Roles and Responsibilities of a Data Manager include:

1. Answer data questions from members.

- 2. Respond to Subject Access Requests.
- 3. Ensure all the data held within the
- Group is necessary.

4. Ensure all relevant data is deleted/anonymised in accordance with your Group data retention policy.5. Investigate and report data breaches.
