50 ADT passes in 2022

A huge well done and THANK YOU to our Observer team!

More than 20 associates are currently driving with the team – 14 of whom started with us in February with our (now normal) launch meeting. We do this on a Saturday morning approximately every three months – so four courses a year. They meet each other, the training team, committee members and have a brief introduction to Advanced Driving in general. These meetings have been very well received by recent clients. 
Members' Refresher Drives

York Group AGM Speaker

28th February 2023



Richard Gladman, IAM RoadSmart Chief Examiner, was the guest speaker at our AGM. He^Is an Advanced Police Driver, Advanced Police Motorcyclist, he worked as Roads Policing Senior Investigating Officer and as Instructor, at the Police Motor Driving School in Hendon.

He talked to us about the 'bible' - ie Roadcraft and how it all began in note form and word of mouth, by 6th Earl of Cottenham in 1937. In its written form, in 1954, it was called Attention all Drivers, which later became Roadcraft, as we know it, in 1960.

We watched a video of a busy, wide road, with two carriageways, somewhere in India. There appeared to be no rules, yet the traffic, which included pedestrians, kept moving. How? The unspoken rule there, which works, is that ¹the vehicle that keeps moving retains the right of way, regardless of its size.' The video then showed a car which stopped while trying to cut across the traffic and caused gridlock. Fascinating.

Richard showed us dashcam footage of appalling driving by motorcyclists, including one who was showing off and nearly hit an oncoming car. His evasion tactic was to crash into the adjoining field. Another, traveling at speed, simply wasn't looking ahead and had no option but crash between two HGVs whilst saying, s**t !!

Richard played a motorway dashcam clip of a motorcyclist crashing into the back of a car, which had just changed lanes. The rider catapulted up and over the roof of the car because the motorist braked. It was pointed out that if we hear a loud bang, we should not brake automatically, but slow gradually.

We discussed the dangers of handsfree mobile phone calls whilst motoring and how our driving becomes impaired. We debated the difficulties and distractions of huge touch screens in modern cars, against simple buttons in older vehicles. We were told about the dangers of sitting alongside an HGV, possibly in a blind spot and reminded to wait until it is safe to overtake fully, even if the driver behind you is impatient.

Finally, we watched a Dashcam Confession from America, with the camera on the driver. He was playing loud music, moving to the music, occasionally taking both hands off the wheel and singing along, having a great time. Not to be recommended, but it gave us all a good laugh.

Now retiring from committee work we thank them all for their long service and commitment to York IAM Group.








The BEN FORD TROPHY (for success in the IAMRS MASTER's TEST)
