Directions to the Birkenshaw Liberal Club

10 Croft Street, Birkenshaw, Bradford, BD11 2HT









From the M62 West leave at Junction 26 and take the A58 towards Leeds. At the second roundabout turn left into Bradford Road (A651) after about 700yds by the George pub, turn right into Town Street. Croft Street is approximately 60yds from the junction (top photo left) but to avoid the potholes carry on up Town Street and turn right into Old Lane. After approximately 100yds turn right into Croft Street (middle picture left between the car and the house next to it).

From Bradford follow the A650. Turn right onto the A651 at the traffic lights just before Tong Academy. Then just after the George pub turn left into Town Street and follow the previous directions.

From the M62 junction 27, take the A650. Turn left onto the A58. After approximately ½ mile turn right into Old Lane After approximately 550yds turn left into Croft Street (bottom picture left).

There is a large car park and the entrance is down the right hand side of the club as shown in the top picture.

Our meetings are held in the function room.

April Meeting A Miscellany of Video and Audio Clips

Although our speaker secretary, Sally, has been working hard to arrange the speaker programme we occasionally have a speaker drop out at the last minute. To cope with this eventuality we have a few backup presentations ready. For our April meeting we had to use one of these backups with a few video clips and a couple of audio clips that I had prepared.

The first video followed on from the dashcam footage shown last year with a couple of cyclists completely ignoring a red traffic light. They were fortunate that there was nothing coming across the junction. Then an obvious overtake at well over the speed limit and a near miss when a van overtook my car and a bus on double white lines. Again a lucky near miss.

Gliding at the Wolds Gliding club near Pocklington followed, when one of my work colleagues arranged an evenings gliding. I think everyone who took to the air had a big smile on their face when they landed.

You may have heard of the Toboggan Run on the Island of Madeira where the locals used to transport goods down to the harbour using a sledge like carrier. Now instead of goods they transport tourists about 2km along public roads on sledges. When Caroline and I visited the island a few years ago I videoed the whole trip and edited it into a short video. It sounds "dangerous" but they have been doing it for years and it is quite safe as long as the traffic is stopped on the road that crosses the route. I'd highly recommend it if you ever visit the island although the average speed is only around 11mph!

I've also been experimenting with making time lapse videos and, as we have a view of fields from our house, the next video was hay making speeded up. They work fast in our area!

Finally a couple of audio clips but the laptop and speakers appeared to be almost inaudible so the clubs PA system was used to boost the sound of firstly "Balham Gateway to the South" a spoof travelogue from the 1950s by Peter Sellers. This was actually engineered by George Martin who a few years later became the "fifth" Beatle looking after their recording sessions.

The second audio clip was how to deal with unwanted cold callers. I'm not sure how many of us would have the nerve to treat the cold callers in the same way but if you can it can be a source of great amusement. This was followed by an impromptu discussion on ways the members present had dealt with cold and spam callers. Some great ideas were explored. Must remember to try some of them the next time I receive an unwanted call!

Minutes of the 2023 Annual General Meeting

Date: Monday, 5th June 2023

Time: 20:00 hrs.

Welcome

The Chairman welcomed Group Members, Associates, and Guests to the AGM.

There being 19 full Members in attendance for the meeting, it was declared quorate.

Everyone was reminded that only Full Members of the Group were entitled to vote during the elections and for approvals and adoptions.

1. Apologies for Absence

Apologies were received from Rosie Bricis (Treasurer) and Lesley Pollard.

2. Minutes of the 2022 AGM

A copy of the 2022 minutes had been included in the May newsletter.

3. Adoption of the 2022 AGM Minutes

Proposed : Charles Holland-Keen Seconded : Chris Marrison

The adoption of the minutes was approved unanimously.

4. Matters arising from the 2022 AGM Minutes

There were no matters arising from the 2022 minutes.

5. Chairman's Report

The Chairman summarised her report which is attached to these minutes.

In addition, the Chairman announced that David Stringer would not be standing as President for the coming year and thanked him for the contribution to the Group both as President and in assisting the Chief Observer in recent years, but also for his many years of service to MYAM and preceding groups.

6. Secretary's Report

The Secretary gave an update on the current position of the Group following a relatively quiet year.

No changes to the rules of the Group had been made in the previous year, and all Committee meetings had been held successfully.

7. Treasurer's Report

In the absence of the Treasurer (due to ill-health) the Secretary presented the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2023. Summary accounts are attached:

- Our costs in 2022-23 exceeded our income, as it has in most years (except for Covid years), though we have reserves in the bank to cover these.
- Income
 - Associate fees were lower than last financial year, as MYAM did not take on new Associates for most of 2022-23.
 - £475 received in Gift Aid includes 2021-22, as well as 2022-23 (claims made July 2022 and February 2023)

Costs

- Biggest costs are those for meeting/speaker expenses, which increased as we started to meet more often following Covid; included buffets at the AGM and the Christmas quiz.
- Our next biggest expense is printing and posting physical copies of the newsletter.
- Observers catching up on the training of existing Associates resulted in extra mileage being claimed.

There were no questions from the Members regarding the accounts.

8. Adoption of Accounts for 2022/23

Resolution: That the Annual Report and Accounts for the year ended 31 March 2023, be approved and adopted.

Proposed: Paul Macro Seconded: Giles Dive

The accounts were approved and adopted unanimously.

9. Membership Secretary's Report

The Membership Secretary presented his report, and this is attached.

10. Chief Observer's Report

The Chief Observer summarised his report, which is attached to these minutes.

11. Election of Group Officers

Bob Rowles conducted the election.

The Secretary confirmed that all nomination papers had been received and properly completed.

The nomination papers were read, and it was agreed that the Officers should be elected en bloc.

12. Election of Group Committee Members

The Chairman read the following information:

Two Committee Members had offered themselves for re-election and two coopted members were required to be ratified:

13. Address by the new Chairman

The Chairman thanked the Members for re-electing her to the post of Group Chairman and noted the Committee's ongoing requirements for assistance.

14. Authority to Increase Subscriptions during the Current Financial Year

The Chairman explained that this is a standard item on the AGM agenda, and it is not the Committee's intention to make any further subscription increase for the foreseeable future.

The proposal was passed unanimously.

15. Any Other Business

The Secretary reminded members of an offer to attend a WYAMs event being held in the coming weeks.

The meeting closed at 21.05 hrs.

As many of you are already aware, I found it necessary to take a sabbatical following a bad reaction to the Covid-19 vaccine. However, thanks to the support of our President and all the wonderful members of the Committee, I am now feeling better and very pleased to be with you at this AGM.

This has been very much a "catch-up" year. Following the pandemic and the lockdown, we found ourselves with a long waiting list of Associates wishing to take the IAMR test and a severe lack of Observers. However, I am pleased to say that, thanks to the efforts of our Chief Observer (Chris Marrison), with the support and guidance of our President (David Stringer) and senior National Observer (Bob Rowles), the waiting list has been addressed. As a result, we are now "open for business" once more and taking on new Associates.

Chris and Graham Crawshaw (our Membership Secretary) will be giving you more detailed information on Associate, Membership, and Observer numbers, along with details of our pass rates.

Your Committee continues to work very hard on your behalf, and, during this year, we have been pleased to co-opt two new Members – Sally Lawrence and Ken Newton. presentation on "Using Your Dash Cam". I have had one for several years, but have never really got to grips with it! I learned a great deal that evening, but it was also a relief to find I was not on my own! Please remember that the monthly speaker meetings are free, and you are very welcome to bring guests with you. Everyone is always welcome.

On a sad note, we now find ourselves in a position where we must sell the Group caravan. The Wakefield Council depot where it is currently stored is moving, and we still do not have anyone to tow it on a regular basis. However, Chris has found alternative venues as bases for Observer training and Associate runs, and we may still be able to attend some classic car rallies in the future, as we still have a gazebo. The decision has therefore been taken to advertise the caravan, along with some of the duplicated equipment we currently hold. If you are interested, please keep a look out for further information in the newsletter.



Pathfinder Yorkshire 2nd – 6th April 2024

This was the first event at this site and the owner was most welcoming and showed enthusiasm for the event. All pre-visits were very satisfactory and the dates were confirmed and we were given the go ahead. Being slighty larger then the previous site with a near perfect surface we knew that we could now develop a more useable road layout before and after the initial ungraded areas were completed.

Monday was spent setting up all the facilites and preparing the layout of the cones ready for the course to begin on the following day.

On the Tuesday all but one of our clients arrived and we duly went through the morning briefing and dispatched the young drivers and their associates to their ungraded areas.

Lunch time went as expected with a presentation from Safer Road Humber on Speed Awareness and by end of the first day we had 13 who had reach level 3 a lower number than expected but we had the space to remove one ungraded area to design a different road layout for them.

Wednesday saw rain but we managed to get all but one to Level 3. The police camera van saw many visitors. Over lunch there was a session on Causes of Collisions. The rain returned in the afternoon meaning the braking demo had to be postponed.

With better weather on Thursday, Overtaking was practiced throughout the day with a lunchtime briefing on the consequence of collision and the braking demo went ahead in the afternoon.

Friday began damp but the sun came out and dried the surface allowing further instruction on the course to be given. The lunch time session was Assertiveness.

The last day, Saturday, turned out to be dry but very windy and it dried up most of the standing water on site and, to the delight of everybody, an unmarked BMW estate police car turned up. It arrived because one of the associates (who works for the police in Durham) had arranged for it to here all day AND allow the young drivers to drive it with full blues and twos. The smiles on their faces was still there at the end of day. The presence of such a vehicle has now been arranged for the last day on each of the next two courses.

In conclusion, with more space, a better road surface and with the enthusiasm of the volunteers we had a very good week and with almost 50% of the young drivers reaching level 1 which is testament to the fact that what we are doing is keeping up the interest and standard of driving amongst young people contributing to the saving of lives.
