Chairman's Article

I thank all of you for your patience and understanding; physical meetings have not been possible and this year we will have had only 2 Group meetings, each by Zoom. I look forward to a relaxation of the restrictions that will allow us to get together in person and rekindle our camaraderie. As we come to the end of a calendar year, we naturally review what has been and look forward to what is to come. This report covers both those aspects, but I will start by looking forward. Firstly, we will be holding a Group Night on Wednesday 16th December via Zoom; invites to be sent out by separate email. The theme of the evening will be a motoring-related quiz and there will be prizes awarded – in the form of Amazon vouchers - for 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes. A sample question is given later. Though deprived of our normal December / Christmas event, with lavish catering, we may hold a seasonal toast, and one for absent friends. One such friend is Deborah Brooksbank, who passed away in November (see next page).

We have decided on a change to the meeting structure, which will be phased in as Covid restrictions allow, meaning some meetings early in 2021 may have to be via Zoom; we will publish details of these meetings in the Newsletter. When we can, we will be holding at least one, possibly two, open Committee meetings, so everyone will have the chance to observe the Committee in action. The plan for future Group Nights, still to be held on 3rd Wednesdays, is as follows – although the venues remain undecided:

- March AGM (*)
- April Speaker or Open Committee Meeting (** / ***)
- June Meet the Observer / Observed Drives
- September Meet the Observer / Observed Drives
- November Speaker or Open Committee Meeting (** / ***)
- December Christmas Meeting

(*) With the approval of HQ, there will be no AGM in 2021, so our next AGM will be in early 2022, after which we can revert to an annual meeting in March

(**) Speaker – if available – to be motoring / road-safety related. Suggestions for such speakers are welcomed

(***) Routinely, Committee meetings will be held on 1st Wednesdays

In addition, we want to hold the President's Cup event again during the summer. The event is a test of slow manoeuvring and judgement. Also, once meetings are allowed, we intend to hold the Volunteers' Dinner, a recognition of the service given to the Group by Committee members and Observers – along with their partners.

We have decided to instigate a new annual award – to recognise the most improved Associate. Details are still being finalised, but I can reveal it will be called the Peter Phillips Award. Peter was an Examiner for over 30 years and has been associated with the Group for over 45 years and thankfully, will remain a member after his retirement. He always seemed to identify the key elements of issues

facing the Committee and provided excellent counsel for myself and my predecessors. Thank you, Peter, we wish you well in your retirement and look forward to seeing you at future meetings. Alex Hathaway has been appointed the Examiner for our area, although he will not be joining the Committee as an Ex Officio (as Peter was) – at least for the foreseeable future.

We are also going to rename the Vincent Brooksbank Award, given in recognition of Services to the Group, to the Vincent & Deborah Brooksbank Award.

Now to 2020 – what a year!! Everything started normally, as it probably did for most of you, but was stood on its head in March, firstly, with the resignation of Melvyn Smith as Chair, and then Covid! The first casualty was our AGM at Police HQ, which was cancelled just 48 hours before it was due to take place and, since then, communication has been either by phone, email or Zoom. Very little observing has been possible since March, except for a short period in the Autumn. HQ has stated that operations are suspended until the situation eases.

A new Committee was, however, formed and has held regular meetings via Zoom, with some notable achievements.

- New Communications Policy
- Updated Complaints Policy
- Updated Risk Assessments, to include Covid-19
- Revised Group Rules and Constitution
- Increased Mileage Allowance for travel on behalf of the Group
- New Award for Associates
- Amended name for Services to Group Award to recognise Deborah Brooksbank

She used to cater for the Christmas Group nights and there was always enough to go round! Though she not a whizz on the computer, she set up the online account with HMRC so the Group could benefit from Gift Aid on your subscriptions. A former Approved Driving Instructor, road safety was in her veins. Sadly, her health declined latterly and she left the Group in 2018. RIP and Thank You, Deborah.
