SAM Driving Day

Following a model used successfully elsewhere, SAM is planning to host the first Driving Day for Associate, Full, and Observer members. There is one thing we all have in common: we have an above-average interest in driving. For many drivers, after passing their advanced test, the journey ends, even though there is always more to learn and more fun to be had behind the wheel.

The format is simple: on Saturday 18th May, those who have signed-up will meet (location TBC depending on numbers, but will be somewhere central in our patch) and be paired-up with another member for the morning. Suggested routes will be available, each lasting 40-60 minutes (but feel free to go off-piste), on which a member will drive while the other navigates and takes an active interest in what is going on. After completing a route, grab a coffee, have a chat (about the drive and/or anything else), and then swap roles: the other person driving their car on the same or a different route. We all meet back for lunch, which may either be bought from the café

or you can bring your own (beyond one's own fuel, a Driving Day has no mandatory costs), after which you will be paired with a different member to go out and do another couple of drives.

This is not a race, nor a rally, nor a treasure hunt. The point of this exercise is primarily to have some fun driving, but there are many secondary benefits. Getting to know other members (often an Associate will only ever get to meet their own Observer) should be quite interesting in itself, as should watching how other drivers approach different situations. These are not 'observed drives', but whether you're driving with someone who has just passed their L-Test, or the Chief Examiner, there *will* be things they do differently, and *may* be things which you would like to incorporate into your own driving. Talk about such things!

Four 40-60 minute drives in a day is designed to allow for a very relaxed pace to proceedings. No one should feel pressured to make any more progress on the road than they are comfortable with, and the chats over brews and lunch are there to be enjoyed for as long as they take.

As this is the first time SAM has organised such a thing, we *really* need your participation to prove the concept. To that end, here are a few popular excuses and reasons they don't apply:

- "I thought only the bikers were social?" - We can't let them have all the fun, can we? ...And, if you're a bike *and* car driver, why not come and try being sociable on four wheels?
- "I don't fancy anyone else observing me" - These are not observed drives. Ask for feedback, if you want it, but none should be given unless sought.
- "I don't fancy observing anyone else" - See above 😊
- "What about insurance?" - You're only driving your own car.
- "I don't have a suitable car" - Congratulations on your purchase of a BAC Mono! For everyone else with at least one passenger seat, as long as it has tax, insurance, and MoT (if applicable), and it works, you *do* have an appropriate car.
- "Can I come as a passenger only?" - Yes!! Even if you can't drive this time, you can still participate in the co-driving process.
- "Will I use much fuel?" - You'll be driving on mixed roads for around two hours. So, if you bring a Dodge Viper, yes, you'll use a lot of fuel. If you bring anything else, it should be little more than a single observed run during training.
- "I'm busy that day" - No you're not. It's weeks away! Move whatever else you've got in the diary. This is more fun! If it's your wedding anniversary, bring your spouse! They might enjoy it too. 😊
On a more serious note, if you *really* can't make it on this occasion, but otherwise would have liked to come, please let us know.

In summary, as the name suggests, this is a *Driving Day*. It's what we're all interested in and the point is to enjoy the drive and each other's company, rather than to go anywhere in particular.
