



Q1

When can you legally drive without wearing a seat belt?

You don't need to wear a seat belt if you are:

a driver who is reversing, or supervising a learner driver who is reversing in a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue services a passenger in a trade vehicle and you're investigating a fault driving a goods vehicle on deliveries that is travelling no more than 50 metres between stops

a licensed taxi driver who is 'plying for hire' or carrying passengers Medical Exemption Certificate



Q2

What action should you take turning left?



Rule 146

Take extra care at junctions. You should

- watch out for cyclists, motorcyclists and pedestrians as they are not always easy to see
- watch out for pedestrians crossing a road into which you are turning. If they have started to cross they have priority, so give way.



Q3

When must sidelights be used?

Sidelights must be switched on between sunset and sunrise even in brightly lit areas


when your car is parked on a road (or a lay-by on a road) where the speed limit is greater than 30mph



Q4

When can you enter a yellow box junction?

You MUST NOT enter the box until your exit road or lane is clear. However, you may enter the box and wait when you want to turn right, and are only stopped from doing so by oncoming traffic, or by other vehicles waiting to turn right. At signalled roundabouts you MUST NOT enter the box unless you can cross over it completely without stopping



T-junction with priority over vehicles from the right



Q9

How many different coloured studs on motorways and dual carriageways ⁵

White studs mark the lanes or the middle of the road.

Red studs mark the left edge of the road.

Amber studs mark the central reservation of a dual carriageway or motorway.

Green studs mark the edge of the main carriageway at lay-bys and slip roads.

Green/yellow studs indicate temporary adjustments to lane layouts, e.g. where road works are taking place.

Moving – other vehicles, people, bicycles, horses

Variable – weather conditions

Your vehicle should be in the correct position on the approach

You should be travelling at the correct speed for the corner or bend

Correct gear for the speed

Should be able to stop safely within the distance you can see to be clear

Quadruples the braking distance

Concentrating on a specific point and being oblivious to the surrounding


RED lights flash alternately




