I purchased the new highway code when it was published earlier this year and I was surprised by an omission which I thought should be in there. I might have missed it but I could not see it and so I ask this question: What is the number one rule when using the roads in the UK. The top priority before anything else. But this rule is missing from the new Highway Code, do you know what it is?

Training/Observing

Associates are wonderful people who have paid a lot of money, to become safer, 'better' riders, what ever that means to them. We are in the same mind always wanting to do better. There have been over the last 30 plus years updates on the Highway Code (HC), Road Craft (RC) and the IAM's Associate Course Handbook. We apply ourselves and develop our riding to maintain the best skills and safety standards we can. To this end CAM have now introduced Observer quality standard checks in line with the pre-test check rides NO's carry out for Associates. Today, Observers need a good knowledge of the new and updated law/rules in the current HC e.g. H1, H2 and H3 with others that have been amended.

You arrange your first meeting with your Associate and they don't turn up! You have to call them and they say it's raining your reply so? They say I don't ride in the rain. Deep breath,....and you say well that is not a reason not to ride, we all ride in the rain and it is a very good way to hone your bike control skills. So you re arrange your meeting and its not raining. You now start your introduction and open up your conversation and guide lines on your training system as per the meeting guide (see CAM website resources, aid memoire). You find out about their riding history and what, if any, other bikes they have had prior to the one they have now. After about 20/25 minutes you ask them to guide you to the next town, or coffee shop, say about ten miles away, you've done the bike safety checks etc. signed the disclaimer, then thumbs up before you set off. Enjoy

Observing/training is a fab way to maintain your own skill set and makes you think, why do we ride 'the system' and you question yourself which we should do all the time.

CAM has a good reputation and training levels so have a great year
